STAFF RESOURCES

PROGRAM ACTIVITIES			
Participants are asked about their risks for infectious disease during the intake process that questions about medical issues			
Participants are engaged in a formal risk assessment regarding HIV and other infectious diseases			
Participants learn about their risks for infectious disease and how to protect themselves			
Treatment and prevention of infectious disease are integrated into discharge plans, harm reduction or relapse prevention plans			
Program promotes and supports prevention strategies including: vaccinations for Hep A and Hep B, other prevention medications, hygiene tools or resources			
Program promotes and supports universal precautions practices in all program activities			
PROGRAM RESOURCES			
Provides educational materials to program participants about prevention and treatment of HIV, HAV, HBV HCV			
Has posters or other materials in the program environment that teach about the treatment and prevention of HIV, HAV, HBV, HCV and other infectious diseases			
Provides tangible tools and resources like condoms, hand sanitizers, clean toilets, and other resources			
Provides referrals for pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) for HIV

PROGRAM POLICIES AND PRACTICES			
Program has policies that promote and support program participants to get vaccinated for HAV & HBV			
Program has policies that every program participant has an infectious disease risk assessment and is linked to prevention and treatment services, if needed and is documented in the record.

PROGRAM ENVIRONMENT			
Physical environment provides access for participants to facilities and resources for proper handwashing

Program has made connections with programs that provide prevention services for infectious disease, including PrEP
